◆ It is so good to be able to start out my report reflecting on the news that CMS suspended the **Pre-Claim Review Demonstration Project (PCRD)** in Michigan and the other four targeted states. In addition, we also received news that CMS has delayed the new Conditions of Participation (CoP's) until the end of this year. I am appreciative of all the grassroots lobbying MHHA members put into this effort to educate your legislators and solicit their support for our priority issues. Suspending Pre-Claim Review and delaying the CoP's were among our top priority issues for our lobby day in Washington on March 21. Thank you so much to the members who heeded MHHA's request to travel to legislator meetings in Washington DC, make phone calls, and contact your federal legislators. There is lots of credit to go around as the effort was truly a collaboration of grassroot members and our national associations working with MHHA and the other state associations across the country. MHHA members must remain engaged as CMS revamps Pre-Claim Review and comes back with a revised program. We expect the program to be much less onerous and may even be on optional program. Also, be aware that the CoP's Rules are only delayed six months which is still not much time to prepare for the comprehensive change to the rules. ◆ **It's A Whole New Ball Game**, is the theme for the 2017 MHHA Annual Conference held May 3-5, at the Grand Traverse Resort. MHHA's Education Committee has outdone themselves this year with an unprecedented line up of speakers and experts. Get your registration in soon. There are more education sessions than one person can attend so consider bringing multiple from your organization and take advantage of multiple registration discount. Members are encouraged to donate and bid on silent auction items for the auction held in the Exhibition Hall during the Conference. ◆ The last meeting was an onsite meeting with both the Reimbursement Committee and the Biller's Committee. The group participated in a presentation by Robin Light, RN and other representatives from Acelity regarding disposable wound vac billing (dNPWV). They gave a very informative session on how to bill and provided the group with handouts. The website to get the handouts is

◆ The Annual Legislative Day had over 40 agencies representing MHHA. It was requested that another date not slated as MHHA's legislative be scheduled in a few months to emphasize the importance of what's happening with the very aggressive audit tactics and hefty regulations approaching. ◆ The group has decided to continue our joint quarterly meetings with the Biller's Committee. We also further discussed the need for all committees to meet at least annually to discuss topics that are affecting home health as an industry whole. Other topics discussed were:

1. The CMS Pricer and it not working for a year and a half. MHHA to get involved now.
2. PCR mini panel discussion requested by the group to include Clinical Ops, Reimbursement, Billing and Regulatory. Amy Gil to present at Clinical Ops for possible agencies to participate in panel discussion.
3. QAPI and 5-Star workgroups proposed and to be presented at Clinical Ops by Amy Gil.

## Palliative Care

◆ Currently Palliative Committee is working on developing a legislative priorities letter that will be sent to the Governor in an attempt to reconvene a Commission for Palliative Care in Michigan. This commission, would address key priorities related to Palliative Care. We are currently looking for feedback for our Palliative Committee Members to outline these priorities. ◆ We are in discussion about the POLST Project and evaluating the use of this tool in Michigan. We are reviewing a National POLST Collaborative letter as well as legislation related to MI-POST that was re-introduced into the house recently. ◆ Reviewing NP changes in prescribing of Schedule II (opioids) which is a change for Michigan. This will allow NP's to prescribe Schedule II medications in Michigan with a delegation agreement by the collaborating physician. ◆ Reviewing medication disposal policies/procedures with the support of Dr. Phil Rodgers from U of M. This is a key issue as patients/families are unsure how to dispose of medications appropriately. We will review options and plan to provide resources and information to our membership as well as have links through the MHHA website. ◆ Opioid Abuse Prevention Package with several bills related to this initiative was introduced into Michigan legislation. We will review this package and provide information and updates to the membership.

## Public Policy

◆ March was an active month for advocacy. March 9<sup>th</sup> approximately 40 members of the association attended the Annual State Legislative Day. There was a good turnout of legislators (77). Thank you to all of those who attended the event and helped to make sure it was a success. As a follow-up we would encourage you to reach out to your local legislators and invite them to come for a site visit to learn more about your programs. ◆ The NAHC March on Washington was also held on March 21<sup>st</sup>. NHPCO is hosting a Washington DC Advocacy Day on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. NCART (DME Complex Rehab) hosts a Washington Advocacy day on April 27, and AAhomecare (HME) on April 24-25. Anyone interested in participating or wanting more information should contact Barry Cargill at the MHHA office ([barryc@mhha.org](mailto:barryc@mhha.org) or 517 349-8089). ◆ The budget process is moving quickly. Sandy Jones, Association Lobbyist, has continued to have 1 on 1 conversations with legislators about our specific budget concerns. Hospice Residence Medicaid Room and Board boiler plate language is in the budget. Funding for Medicaid seems to be somewhat safe until 2019. On Friday, CMS indicated that as of April 1<sup>st</sup>, the pre-claim review demonstration will be paused for a minimum of 30 days in Illinois and will not expand into Florida as planned. This is thanks to the hard work of providers, state and national associations. Your voice matters!

◆ **Executive Director** Congratulations to Amy Banfield for her new role as VP Operations for Southern Care Michigan and Wisconsin. ◆ **NGS/CMS** –new job aid for NOE/New Video for Documentation Eligibility, good leadership from Corrine Ball that has significantly improved the relationship between Providers and NGS. She will be at the MHHA Conference in Traverse City, May 3-5. Next meeting is in June, send all questions to MHHA or to Sherri Soloman at [Sharon.Solomon@Trinity-Health.org](mailto:Sharon.Solomon@Trinity-Health.org). ◆ **MILARA** –Meeting April 12 with MILARA and MHHA Stacey Knierim-Clark and Christine Weir will represent Hospice at the meeting. Questions to the MHHA office prior to the meeting would be appreciated. Waiver and CNA renewal needs to be on the agenda. ◆ Michele Lawford RDN, BS, Michigan Nutrition Consultants, RDN, BS was invited as a guest to the Committee. She has an interest in nutrition in Hospice and is interested in knowing about nutritional assessment in Hospice. Michele is interested in getting more continuity in nutritional assessment and the utilization of Dietitians in Hospice. The MHHA Hospice Committee asked Michele to please bring back to the group a standard of practice for Hospice related to dietary assessment and to share with the group. The Committee suggested she submit a survey that we could send out to our members. ◆ **Education Committee:** May 3-5 Traverse City Michigan Hospice Committee Meeting will be during the conference. We will ask a Hospice Leaders to Chair. ◆ **Regulatory:** CNAs eight hour of consecutive training new CNA renewal form is requesting a NPI number. Rene Wheaton spoke to the State they said that that area of the form can be left blank. We will be discussing with MILARA. In 2012, there was a requirement that there was eight hours of facility training for CNA renewal. MHHA was able to overcome this challenge in 2012 with the State Agency. Prometric continues however to ignore that not all CNAs work shifts in facilities. Senator Hopgoode has legislation that MHHA will be monitoring. The challenge is that our Nurse Aides are in Medicare Facilities. Facilities require Hospice aides in facilities to be CNAs. ◆ There is now a listserv for Regulatory for Hospice via MHHA please let the MHHA office know if you would like to sign up. ◆ In November, Hospice will need to be compliant with emergency planning. Our plan must involve coordination with local emergency preparedness organizations. Barry will invite the Emergency Preparedness Agency lead for Region 1 to come and speak to us at the June meeting. By November Hospice will need to have a plan, a drill with outside community resources involved. And also, to have completed a table top exercise. ◆ Palmetto is instituting pre-claim review for Hospice --100 claims for Hospice will be pulled randomly. Rene Wheaton forwarded to Therese Forrester at NAHC. ◆ **Palliative Care: The Committee is working on**

**the development of a Palliative Care Commission under the Governor's office that came out of the Cancer Network Report.** ◆ Reimbursement: There was a Medicaid Meeting and will meet with us quarterly. Medicaid Managed was the topic of discussion Theresa Landfair [landfair@michigan.gov](mailto:landfair@michigan.gov) is the contact. Send issues to Theresa so that she has examples to provide the Payers. For ICO patients the ICO requires the 1074 to be sent to them. They are sending a fax number to Barry. Lynn Hicks is back with Medicaid working on Hospice claims. New timely filling policy effective 1/1/2017. There is a virtual conference upcoming April 20<sup>th</sup>. MHHA will send out the details. Nancy and Barry are also coordinating a meeting together with Blue Cross. ◆ Hospice Residence Committee: Next week Wednesday April 12, 2017 2 p.m-3 p.m. ◆ Residence Room and Board: The Governor did put money in the budget for Room and Board for Hospice Residences. The Hospice programs needed to submit a request to participate. The timing was intentionally problematic. Discussion ensued regarding dual licensure for Hospice residences. Recommend staying dually eligible. ◆ Public Policy: State Legislative Day 77 legislators were present. Tomorrow 10 a.m. Public Policy Committee Call. ◆ Membership Committee will develop a plan and speak to the group next month. ◆ New Business Hospice Analytics: This company is willing to benchmark, they sponsor a newsletter that will be distributed. There are 25 State Hospice Organizations working with them. They utilize cost report data to benchmark. Lagging data, will commit for one year. ◆ We Honor Veterans is meeting the second Thursday of every month. There will be a steering committee for the State. Group is working on the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Selfridge Airforce Base we will have a vendor booth. The event is in August.

## Regulatory Committee

◆ There has been a lot happening on the regulatory front this week. First of all, the Pre- Claim Review program has been delayed from continuing into Florida and placed on hold for at least 30 days in Illinois. This is great news also for Michigan because it appears to be less likely than ever that this program will ever be rolled out in its current form here in Michigan. Pre- Claim Review has been such a difficult process from hiring of additional staff, slowing down revenue, causing the return of many, many RAPS, to actually causing agencies to close. It will be interesting to see what CMS develops to replace it. I understand that there is a committee that includes industry experts working on crafting the next iteration of Pre- Claim Review. Some ideas floating out there; it may become a voluntary program which would eliminate a later ADR, it may be targeted at certain diagnoses or services, or may be targeted at agencies not

performing well in other audits. ♦ Next, there is a very possible delay in the works on the new Home Health Conditions of Participation. There is a proposed rule that was published last week, proposing to extend the effective date until January 13. That rule has not been finalized and it is open for a 60 day comment period. So that means in effect, we may not find out definitively until late June or early July what the results will be. More to come I am sure...
