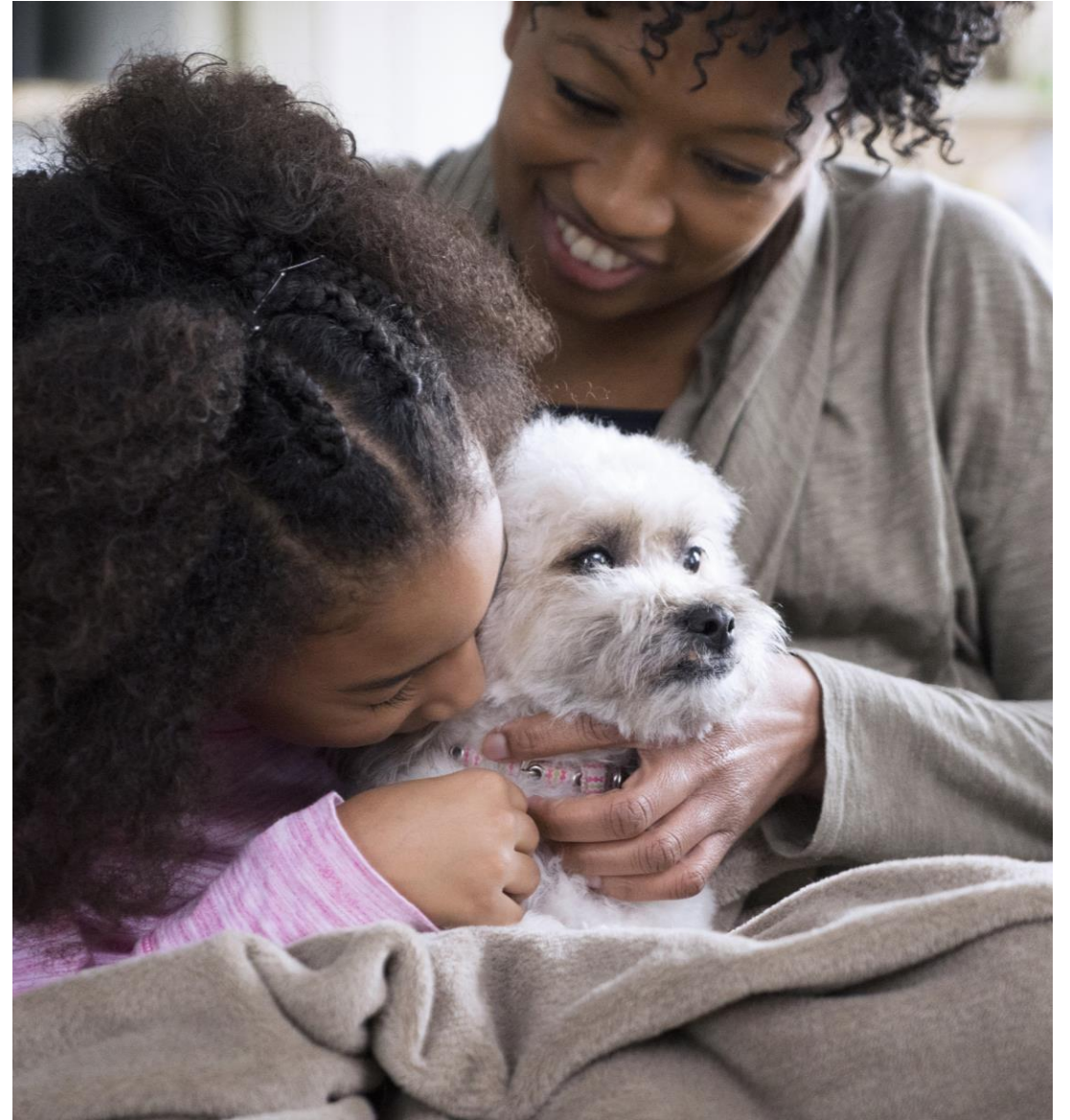

Unborn baby has been dx with life limiting condition

Follow parents and unborn baby during pregnancy

Hospice attends OB visits with family

Meets with family in their homes

Discuss and assist in developing birth plan for multiple outcomes


